



BERNHEIM ARTIST APPAREL LIMITED EDITION SERIES 2020

2020 marks the 40th anniversary of Bernheim's Artist in Residence program and the value that art brings to the natural environment. In honor of this milestone year, Bernheim Arboretum and Research Forest is launching an invitation to the Kentucky artist and design community to submit image designs celebrating the organization's mission of *connecting people to nature*.

Submitted designs can address (but not limited to) the unique aspects of Bernheim's history, geography and wildlife, on-site attractions, nature-based educational programming, research efforts in science, play and art in the landscape. Bernheim colors and fonts are provided with contest rules but are not required for submitted designs.

This call is open to Kentucky-based artists and designers only. In consideration for each selected design, winning artists will receive **\$300**, recognition on Bernheim's website and social media platforms and in any press regarding the winning submissions, plus two pieces of apparel bearing the selected design. In this time of social distancing, applicants are encouraged to navigate **Bernheim's website** and **YouTube channel** for design inspiration.

****The deadline for submissions is midnight EDT on June 1, 2020.**** The winners will be announced in early summer and apparel will be available for purchase by mid-August 2020.

About Bernheim: Bernheim Arboretum and Research Forest is a private, non-profit educational and recreational nature preserve located on a beautiful 16,137-acre property, 25 miles south of Louisville in Clermont, Kentucky. Bernheim includes a nationally recognized 600-acre Olmsted designed arboretum with over 8,000 varieties of plants. The combined property is larger than Manhattan and is the largest area of private, protected land dedicated to education and conservation east of the Mississippi River. Open throughout the year, more than 400,000 visitors connect with nature annually, by enjoying over 40+ miles of hiking trails and abundant recreational and nature-related opportunities, including art, an Edible Garden, a Canopy Tree Walk and a Children's Play Garden.

It was our founder Isaac W. Bernheim's vision for this land to be a place for all people regardless of race, creed or social status to *"further their love of the beautiful in nature and in art, and in kindred cultural subjects, and for educational purposes, and as a means of strengthening their love and devotion to their state and country."*
